### From the Pastor

*"Looking back, my life seems like one long obstacle race, with me as its chief obstacle." (Jack Parr)*

Ever get overwhelmed? When my Grandmother would get overwhelmed with work, anger, excitement, whatever - she would exclaim: "I am just beside myself!" What she meant was that there was just too much of what she was feeling to be contained by one person. To be "beside yourself" was not a good thing (I usually ran and hid)!

But what if where you are starting from is not the best place to be? What if where your life stands right now is not a good place? Maybe if you could get outside yourself if you could get out of the space your heart and spirit are inhabiting, if you could somehow "get beside yourself" instead of being stuck in the same old place, perhaps your life could be made better? Perhaps your life could be transformed. The fourth general law of physics says: the idea of the "adjacent possible" suggests that at any given moment there is a space around every person (and around every institution) of untapped potential. To enter into a new field of energy is the lure of the "adjacent possible." In other words, a halo of possibility and promise is beside yourself.

We know the power of Christ's touch. We know the gift of Christ's sacrifice. We accept his love and forgiveness. But we keep within our carefully structured lives. We stay "within ourselves." What would happen if we chose to move into the "adjacent possible?" What would happen if we turned around and took a hop into the holy? What would happen if we leaped into the unknown that lies just barely outside our zone of comfort and safety? It's not the one who takes the biggest steps that gets the biggest blessings. Sometimes it's the smallest of steps that create the biggest changes if that step is into your "adjacent possible."

Disciples of Jesus, will you find the courage to move into your "adjacent possible?" Are you tired of doing the same thing over and over? Look into your life. Look into your home, your job, your commitments, your family. Do you dare to see what might be possible if you would just shift your vision a bit more to Jesus? Look into our church—our mission, our educational programs, our worship. Do we dare to see what might be possible if we turned away from the temple and turned back to Jesus?

Jesus Christ is the biggest expansion of possibilities in the universe. You are one step away from an explosion of energy that can totally transform your life. Will you take that one step?

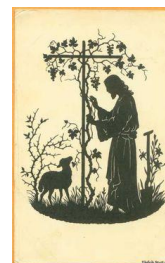

## If it's May, it's Annual Conference Time!



Annual Conference will be held May 27<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> at the On Center in Syracuse.  
The theme this year is the Promise of Harvest.

With more than 168,000 members, the Upper New York Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church comprises 915 churches in 12 districts, covering 48,000 square miles in 49 of the 62 counties in New York State. Our mission is to “live the Gospel of Jesus Christ and to be God’s love with our neighbors in all places.”

This year, Annual Conference has asked each church to take a special collection for ‘Imagine No Malaria’ and bring it to Syracuse. Through your generosity, our Lenten Offering for ‘Imagine No Malaria’ is \$830.

And in a news release dated April 22<sup>nd</sup>, it was announced that Pittsburgh Area Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton has presented a check for \$9.6 million from the people of The United Methodist Church to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria. The gift to the Geneva-based organization is the single largest contribution ever made by a faith-based group, fund officials said.

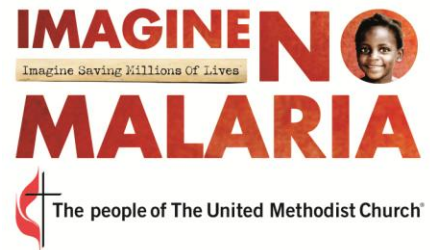
Bickerton presented the check from the denomination’s Imagine No Malaria initiative to Dr. Mark Dybul, executive director of the Geneva-based Global Fund, in a ceremony at the Capitol Visitors Center that was attended by lawmakers, United Methodists and members of secular and global groups. The contribution makes The United Methodist Church one of the most significant non-government contributors to the Global Fund. The money will be used to purchase and distribute insecticide-treated bed nets and other tools to control malaria in Angola, Côte d’Ivoire, Democratic Republic of Congo, Liberia, Mozambique, Rwanda, Sierra Leone, Uganda and Zimbabwe.

## Administrative Updates

### Finance & Stewardship Committee Report for May 2015

Thanks to your faithful stewardship, we can celebrate a number of accomplishments during the month of March 2015:

- † The pastor, with Betty Dingman, continued leading an ecumenical worship service at Springside that was begun in February on the third Saturday of the month.
- † Betty Dingman continued leading a monthly Bible study at Springside that was started on the fourth Wednesday of February.
- † A quarterly friendship brunch was held after church on March 29.
- † Arrangements were made to have memorial plants and contributions for Easter Sunday.
- † The monthly free dinner was served to 106 guests.
- † The Salvation Army was given 54.5 pounds of groceries this month.
- † All bills, including our Ministry Shares assessment, were paid in full and on time.
- † The March Noisy Can Offering of \$136.18 was given to the Shriners' Children's Hospital.



Our March income from pledges and the customary gifts of those who do not pledge were nearly \$1,500 more than projected and total income from all sources for March was about \$80 more than expected. March's total expenditures for current expenses in all areas were about \$2,600 less than expected. Most expense areas spent less than was budgeted for the month. Our March income was about \$250 less than March's expenses.

It should be noted that our projections of income and expenditures are based on the assumption that everything that happens is uniformly distributed over the twelve months of the year. That is not always a valid assumption. Insurance, for example, is paid in one lump sum once each year. Despite their limitations, our assumptions provide a frame of reference to help the Finance Committee discover problems sooner rather than later.

Contributions and fundraising for our Capital Campaign totaled \$1,245 for March; bringing the year-to-date total to \$3,455.27.



The members of the Finance & Stewardship Committee continue to be grateful for your faithful attention to the financial needs of our ministries. Please remember that you can contribute to our Capital Campaign with a minimum of effort or expense on your part by:

- † Contribute good used clothing and house wares (not electronics) to our spring rummage sale on May 1 and 2.
- † Depositing your unwanted used clothing in the collection shed behind the church
- † Purchasing our commemorative Christmas ornaments and telling your friends and neighbors with a connection to our church or Minetto about them
- † Using Shop with Scrip to purchase gift cards through our church account. Garry Visconti can answer questions about the program.

Rev. Rick Sivers is retired again! On Easter Sunday morning, Rick handed his key to Pastor Chuck and said "I'm done!" I thank God for bringing Rick back to Minetto at the exact time we needed someone in the pulpit. When you see Rick, give him a big thank you!



## New Crossroads District Superintendent

Upper New York Area Resident Bishop Mark J. Webb is pleased to announce the appointment of the Rev. Nola Anderson as a Conference Superintendent assigned to the Crossroads District, effective July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015.

Rev. Anderson, pastor at the Grace and West Avenue United Methodist churches in Rochester, currently sits on the UNY Board of Ordained Ministry and has been active in Black Methodists for Church Renewal, the Northeastern Jurisdiction Clergy Women Consultation Planning Team, and Aldersgate Renewal Ministries.

In 2003, Rev. Anderson began serving in the former Wyoming Conference as an elder from the Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas Conference.
